The West Midlands Metro is a convenient and environmentally friendly way to travel and runs frequently, 7 days a week. The Metro journey from Birmingham to Wolverhampton takes 40 minutes and includes all the stops between.

Walking and cycling

Birmingham and the West Midlands are well served with walking and cycling routes and canal towpaths, allowing you to travel in an environmentally sustainable manner whilst also staying fit and healthy. You can explore the West Midlands from a different perspective by following our scenic waterways or immersing yourself in the region's fascinating history with one of our heritage trails.

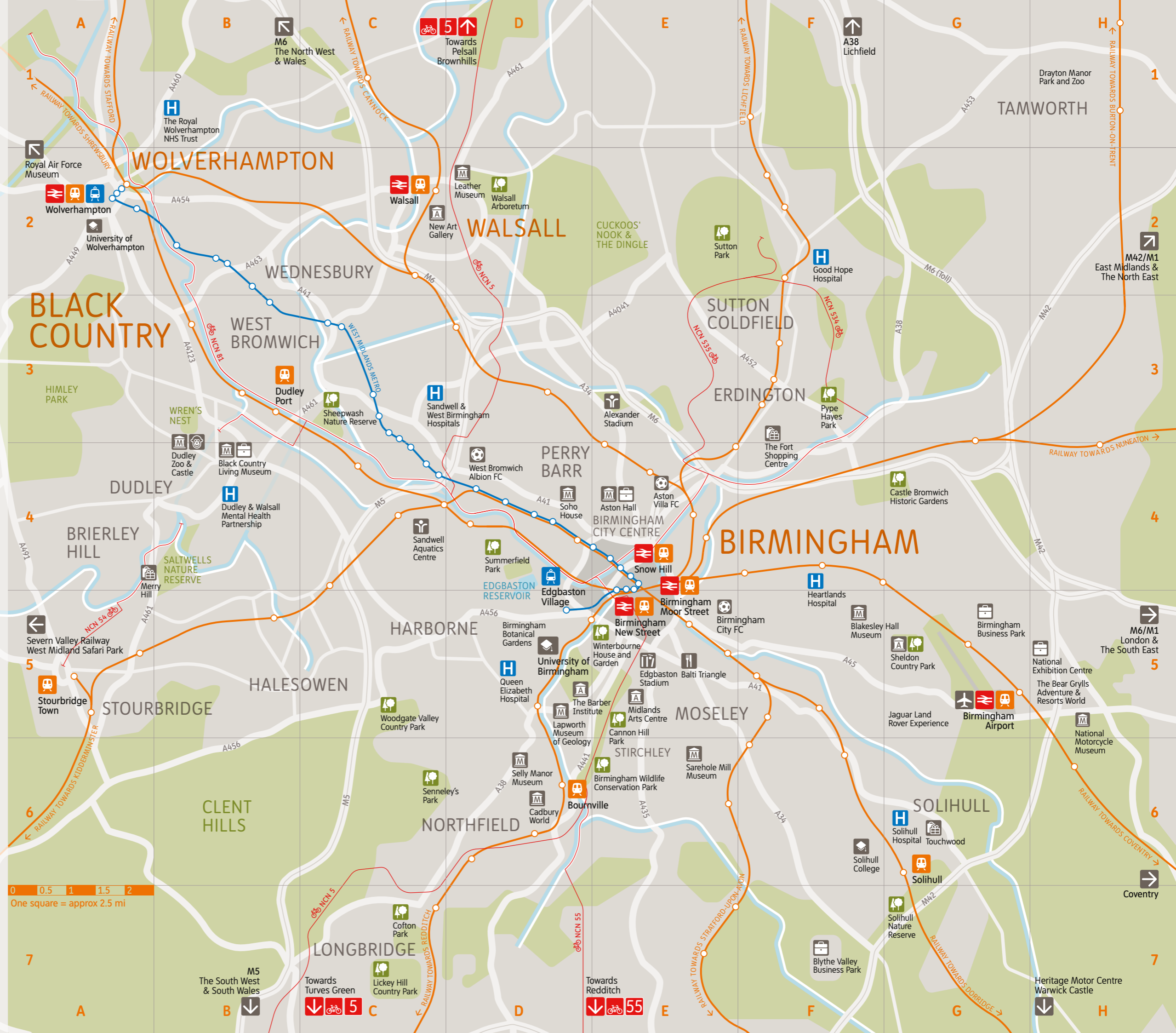
